

## 2020 JOURNAL CITATION METRICS FOR NCA JOURNALS

Journal citation metrics are often required for annual reports and Tenure and Promotion dossiers. Rather than relying on a single "impact factor" metric, NCA provides several different journal citation metrics for its 11 journals. The following metrics reflect 2020 ratings and rankings.

### Citation Metrics

1. Journal Impact Factor (JIF; Web of Science Journal Citation Reports): JIF is the most commonly used metric for assessing journals. JIF is calculated as the number of citations made in the current year to articles in the previous two years (in selected journals) divided by the total number of articles and reviews from the previous two years. Only the journals listed in the Science Citation Index Expanded and Social Sciences Citation Index can have an Impact Factor.
2. CiteScore (CS; Elsevier/Scopus): CiteScore is a ratio of citations to research published, and takes a holistic view of published content, rather than looking only at articles and reviews. CiteScore is calculated as the number of citations recorded in Scopus in any given year to content published in the previous three years divided by the number of items published in a journal in the previous three years.
3. Source Normalized Impact per Paper (SNIP; Elsevier/Scopus): SNIP scores make it easier to facilitate cross-discipline comparisons among journals. SNIP measures article citations in a journal against citation potential for the subject field.
4. Scimago Journal Rank (SJR; Elsevier/Scopus): SJR looks at the impact that a journal's subject field, quality, and reputation has on a citation. This metric does not consider all citations of equal weight; the prestige of the citing journal is also considered. SJR is calculated as the average number of weighted citations in a year divided by the number of articles published in the three years prior.
